- If you must have stairs, install rails on both sides of the stairs.
- Increase stair visibility by using contrast strips on top and bottom stairs.
- Switch to kitchen appliances with easy-to-read controls and simple-to-use push button interfaces.
- Add slip-prevention flooring throughout the bathroom and shower area.
- Well placed grab bars in the shower, tub, and next to the toilet will help prevent falls.
- Add a fold-down seat or bench in the shower.
- Install hand-held, adjustable height, showerheads.
- Add extra lighting in the shower stall.
